## Funded by Loxhore village hall committee

It's good to know that Loxhore traditions continue; the carol singers conveyed by tractor touring the village just before Christmas, the New Year's Day boundary walk, this year with a large and assorted band of children, adults and dogs all undaunted by the muddy conditions and the Kift cup, a light-hearted but keenly fought skittles competition. With this issue comes a list of classes for the 2017 Summer Show so that you can make a start on those entries that need longer preparation. Amazingly it is 10 years since the idea of holding a craft and produce show was conceived by village hall committee members and for this reason there are a couple of 'special' classes for this year only. Also included is the ever-popular 'Potato-in-a-bucket' competition and Alison and Jim Barr have kindly offered to purchase and chit the potatoes ready for you to collect later on. Please let them know if you wish to participate and do consider taking part in other classes too if you haven't done so before. The committee is keen to encourage children to participate as there has always been a dearth of entries in the children's section. As a result, grandchildren of Loxhore residents are always invited to boost numbers.

Local roads are in poor condition, particularly so at this time of year and the lanes are gradually narrowing as weeds colonise the mud and other debris that collects at the sides. As reported previously, Jim Barr has already spent many hours clearing gullies and culverts but the task is huge for one person with a shovel and, like the painting of the Forth Road Bridge, it is ever on-going. Devon County Council is encouraging self-help schemes in these straitened times and with no likelihood of things improving in the near future, David Smith as parish councillor with responsibility for highway 'issues' is calling a public meeting on Thursday 16th February at 7.30pm at the Village Hall. The purpose is to discuss the problems and set up a volunteer workforce team to plan and carry out the necessary highway maintenance work around the village on pre-set dates, followed by community refreshments! Please come along even if you can only spare a little time to help – many hands make light work and we will all benefit from better road conditions.

Members of the Village Hall Committee have proposed the purchase of two defibrillators to be placed in the village and operated if the need arises by trained village residents. The AED's (Automated External Defibrillators) cost **continued overleaf**

about £1500 each and so the committee intends to hold a fund-raising event but would also welcome donations from parishioners. They are also seeking volunteers to undertake training in their use and in CPR at the Village Hall some time in February.

**BIRD FLU** Rather belatedly the Parish Council has received advice from DEFRA (via DCC) regarding outbreaks of Avian Influenza. A Prevention Zone was declared in December that covers the whole of the UK and this means that all poultry keepers, whether on a commercial scale or simply a small backyard flock, are now required by law to house them (keep them under cover) or otherwise keep them separate from wild birds. This requirement (the Prevention Zone) has now been extended until 28<sup>th</sup> February 2017.
