We hope to preserve this for posterity on the Loxhore website also. Another Loxhore road sign has also been found; this time an old wooden finger post with the letters made of metal, probably lead. Unfortunately the wood has decayed and many of the letters have been lost but the name is unmistakeable and therefore a piece of history which the parish council considers worth preserving and displaying at the hall. A suitable display case or cabinet is being sought but if you have the skills and time to construct one we would be pleased to hear from you. Please contact David Smith who can provide the dimensions.

Thank you to Jim Barr who has cleared the gullies on a section of road at the 'top-end' of Loxhore which it is hoped will reduce the amount of surface water flowing down it. The County and District councils are offering a small amount of funding for this purpose and the parish council has applied for this whilst retaining the services, as limited as they are, of the Lengthsman. David Smith has mapped culverts etc. to make them easier to locate in future and as the coordinator of these works, would be pleased to hear from you if you become aware of road problems.

MY TRIP TO UGANDA: On 2nd July I flew to Uganda with the Amigos charity. After a 22 hour journey we arrived at Entebbe airport and then travelled by 'coach' to Kira Farm for 12am on 3rd July.

The following day we started work with the Kira Farm trainees. The farm takes in 40 trainees from all over Uganda every year. Each pupil has suffered from a very traumatic past, which, during their year at Kira Farm, they will overcome and learn to create a brighter future for themselves and their family.

We took part in many projects during our two weeks in Uganda, from building two water jars and farming with the trainees to learning new skills such as carpentry and hairdressing. I became very attached to many of the people and made friends that I will never forget! I was overwhelmed by the positivity and work ethic of the trainees, this made me feel inspired and taught me to appreciate all of the simple things in life. During my stay, I was lucky enough to go on a two hour land safari, where I saw wild animals such as lions, giraffes and elephants, and went on a river safari down the Nile, where I saw hippos and crocodiles. On our final day we visited Kampala market which broke up our journey back to Entebbe.

Now, being home in England, I cannot put into words how much I miss the whole experience. I am very lucky to have been able to take part in this amazing expedition. I am so thankful to everyone who has donated money towards my trip and helped me in the process of fundraising, as I know I couldn't have made it on my own. I feel so passionately towards the Amigos charity of Pilton, that I will no doubt be continuing to fundraise for them. I plan, one day, to visit Kira Farm again so I can help to change the lives of some of the bravest people I have and will ever come across! Thanks again for all of the support I have received.
