June/July 2018 Funded by Loxhore Village Hall Committee

There are several noteworthy items of Parish Council business to report on. Firstly Chris Bryars met with a representative of North Devon Council's Parish Paths Partnership and having walked the local bridleways and footpaths the Parish Council has been awarded a grant to maintain them. An example of the work to be carried out is the repair to paths scoured by the deluge of water during winter storms which currently make them hazardous to walk along.

David Smith pursued South West Water who finally accepted responsibility for the water leak which was bubbling up through the tarmac by the Lower Loxhore post box and this has now been repaired. Subsequently other repairs were carried out further up the hill.

If you detected a pungent aroma a while back which reached at least as far afield as Halsey Lake and Pickada, the source was piles of manure in the fields adjacent to Bratton Lane. In a previous year the farmer had brought in human waste which was subsequently removed as it posed a health hazard and there were concerns that this had been repeated. At the Parish Council's request the piles have been inspected by an Environmental Health Officer who has contacted the farmer with the result that what appeared to be chicken manure has now been ploughed in. There are regulations concerning the management and storage of faecal material, animal waste etc. with regard to the run-off from yards and fields and the impact on nearby watercourses which Environmental Health oversees. On this occasion the Environment Agency has been contacted as nitrates from the manure appear to have entered a pond and watercourses which has unfortunately resulted in the death of a number of Koi carp.
